Meet Sue, a Hurricane Ride-Out Crew Member

## 5 ways to continue National Preparedness Month beyond September ... Ready for it?

With the Atlantic hurricane season lasting until Nov. 30, it's still a great time to make weather preparedness a priority. "The best approach to an unpredictable season is preparing well before you even know a storm is coming," Cast Member Sue mentioned. She makes magic as an Administrative Coordinator and uses her transferable skills of being detail-oriented and resourceful to be "the best team player" as part of the ride-out crew at Magic Kingdom Park.

The ride-out crew Cast Members play a vital role in pre-storm preparation, including filling and placing sandbags, moving items indoors and temporarily staying on property in a pre-selected, safe location during a hurricane.

From the early stages of weather preparedness to riding out the hurricane, Sue mentions how staying alert in your surroundings can make all the difference in the post-storm recovery when preparedness is a priority.

We encourage everyone to take extra caution year-round. Below are resources and best practices to remember during this hurricane season and for years to come.

- Visit the <u>Central Florida Alert HUB site</u> to stay connected with live updates during a hurricane and learn about the variety of resources available for Central Florida Cast Members.
- Make a family emergency communication plan to establish ways to reconnect after unexpected disasters and be sure to test it out.
- Assemble an <u>emergency kit</u> for your home and car. Consider emergency supplies for your children and pets if you have them.
- Pay attention to any Emergency Alerts you get on your phone, and utilize weather apps, local television stations, and the National Weather Service for updated weather information and protocol. Consider purchasing a weather radio to stay updated during emergencies such as power outages or natural disasters that disrupt the flow of information.
- Learn the necessary safety skills such as First Aid/CPR, how to use a fire extinguisher, etc.) or how to prepare for a hurricane because you never know what situations you could be in
